

"The absolute, most important, best thing that you can do for your pastor is to pray for him."

The Best Thing You Can Do For Your Pastor. By Stephen Altrogge

What is the best thing that you can do for you pastor? Compliment him on his "outstanding, almost Charles Spurgeon-like sermon"? Give money to the church? Give your time and skills to the church? Not heckle him? Admire him for his manly beard? While those are all wonderful things, they are not the best thing that you can do for you pastor.

The absolute, most important, best thing that you can do for your pastor is to pray for him.

I was freshly reminded of that fact this morning when I read 2 Corinthians 1:11 -"You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many."

This is Paul talking. The apostle. The dude who wrote a significant portion of the New Testament. The guy who got blindsided by Jesus on Damascus Road. The guy who had the whole "taken up to the third heaven and seeing things too glorious for words" experience. This isn't a little ol' Average Pastor With Minimal Gifting. We are talking about THE Apostle Paul who studied under THE Gamaliel. If anyone could feel sure of his ministry success it was Paul. I would expect Paul to say, "I am confident of my success

in the Lord, but your prayers would also be helpful."

But that's not what Paul says. He says, "You also MUST help us by prayer." There's a hint of desperation in his voice. He is pleading for the prayers of the Corinthians. Why? Why does Paul feel such a deep need for the prayers of others?

Because he knows that the depth of his fruitfulness hinges on the prayers of others. He knows that he will not be successful unless he is propelled forward by the prayers of the saints.

That's why he says that many will give thanks for the blessing granted through the prayers of many. In other words, Paul is expecting people to be grateful to God for his ministry and for the blessings that they have received through his ministry. But how did those blessings come about in the first place? Through the prayers of Paul's friends! Paul's ministry was fruitful because others were praying for him.

Your pastor desperately needs your prayers. I desperately need the prayers of the people in my church. The best thing that a person can do for me is pray on my behalf. The more people pray for me, the more fruitful my ministry will be.

So how can you pray for your pastor? Here are a few practical ways:

Pray that they will have spiritual and emotional endurance. Being a pastor is a wonderful job, but it can also be a very draining job. I need endurance to continue working with joy.

Pray that they will have rich fellowship with the

Lord. The pastor's power comes from the Lord. I need God to meet me and refresh week after week.

Pray that your pastor will be protected from temptation. If Satan can take down a shepherd, the sheep are much more vulnerable. I need the Lord to protect me from the temptations of pride, greed, lust, impatience, and a host of

other sins.

Pray that your pastor will preach with power. Apart from the power of the Holy Spirit, a sermon will be nothing more than an eloquent boatload of crap. I need the Holy Spirit to put power behind my words.

There are many more ways to pray for your pastor, but this should get you started.

So please, I'm begging you, pray. Your pastor depends on it.

Eric Barger coming to Peace



Eric Barger will be speaking at Peace Free Lutheran Church on Sunday, April 22 at both services.

After spending two decades immersed in the world as a record producer, rock musician, drug addict, and New Ager, Eric Barger is now widely recognized in the area of Christian Apologetics and Discernment Ministry. Eric's Take A Stand! Ministries confronts both the culture and the Church, focusing on the Cults, World Religions, the Occult, Spiritual Warfare, and, most particularly, the

troubling unbiblical trends and doctrinal issues facing Christians in these end days. He is the author of numerous books, including the best-seller From Rock to Rock, Entertaining Spirits Unaware: The End-Time Occult Invasion (with co-author David Benoit) and Disarming the Powers of Darkness. Eric has written for USA Today and has been interviewed by hundreds of print and electronic media outlets, including Time Magazine and Fox News. October, 2011, marked the beginning of Eric Barger's 29th year of full-time apologetics and discernment ministry. Each year he travels more than 200 days across the US and Canada presenting his multi-media "Take A Stand!" Seminars in conferences, churches, and Christian schools. With Evangelicals continuing to steadily

slide into doctrinal chaos, Eric Barger is a voice of biblically-based reason -- and warning. Besides refuting unscriptural ecumenism, universalism, the normalization of Islam and Mormonism, and popular yet problematic fads such as the novel, The Shack. 

Surprises Around Every Corner

Almost everything new is exciting—and sometimes scary. That is most certainly true for the children of the Miriam Home! Today we have nine young people and only one of them was with us when school ended for the year, that means eight children are facing a lot of new situations.

Nearly all of the children in the Miriam Home today are 10 years old or over. All of them come from situations where thesy had to take care of themselves; now they have what probably seems like so many

"aunties". To begin with that is pretty hard all by itself - it feels less like being cared for and more like being bossed around, by everyone! The rules that keep the Miriam Home from falling apart feel very restrictive during the first few weeks. But the loving hearts of our house moms are quickly winning over the children.

The next new factor in the kids lives is a new school year! Next week classes begin and, believe it or not, they are looking forward to it! Many are going to new schools and all in new grades.

The biggest "new" in the lives of all the children is the simple unknown. Every child arrives not knowing how long they will stay



with us; most have no idea where they will go when they leave. This isn't an easy "new" to deal with, even as adults. Imagine for a child be they 5, 10 or 17 years old! One of the goals of the Miriam Home is to make this stressful time as easy as possible in the lives of the children. Your prayers make a huge difference! The

precious gifts so many of you have sent, have eternal impact! We recently received a boxes of mini-quilts. We are in the middle of summer right now and noone needs help staying warm but the children, even the oldest, love these mini quilts! They hold them when they watch a dvd at night, or a tv program, and they feel loved. Sheets and used tennis shoes, Tootsie Rolls and stickers have all been amazing ways for kids to feel hugs from thousands of miles away! Bless you and thank you!

Cleberson - has been with us for two months and has won the heart of everyone who meets him. He is five years old and has a deep joy and a ready laugh. He arrived dry as dust but what a difference a little love and



affection has made in his life! Please pray we find the right family for this precious, special little guy!

Luis - Has been here a little over a month and he brings joy and energy to every day! Luis is 10 years old and is also here because of problems his mom is facing. It is likely he will be here a while longer, but he is o.k. with that because his






