"Listen to the Spirit: The Seven Letters to the Churches"

This is our theme for the Lenten Season this year, as we listen to the Spirit of God speaking to the seven churches that are addressed in the book of Revelation. As the Apostle John begins Revelation, the last book of the Bible, he writes, "Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of the prophecy, and heed the things which are written in it; for the time is near." (1:3) God promises a blessing to those who read, listen to, and heed His Word!

John goes on to write, "Behold, He [Jesus] is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see Him, even those who pierced Him; and all the tribes of the earth will mourn

over Him. So it is to be. Amen. 'I am the Alpha and the Omega,' says the Lord God, 'who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." (1:7,8) At His First Coming, Jesus was "pierced" as He died on the cross for our sins to save us, but when He comes again, it will not be as our Suffering and Sacrificial Savior, but as the Sovereign King of kings, Lord of lords, and Judge of all the earth!

Jesus wants for His Bride, His Church, to be ready when He returns in glory at His Second Coming! These seven letters were written to specific churches in the first century, in Asia Minor, but they are also representative of the church at large throughout the world and the Spirit of God continues to speak afresh through His eternal Word in these seven letters still today. These letters are encouraging, challenging, convicting, and exhorting. They begin by calling the church to get ready for Christ's Second Coming by returning to the fervency of its first love for Christ – "You have left your first love" (2:4) and end with an invitation – "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me." (3:20) God wants you to take the time to grow in your fellowship with Him.

Each of the seven letters also contains the statement: "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches." Let us come with open ears and hearts to hear the Spirit this Lenten Season. Pray that God would speak to you through His Word and draw you into a deeper relationship with Jesus through this journey. Please pray for our entire congregation, that God would do His good and gracious work within us this Lenten Season.

FROM THE COUNCIL

- 1. Pastor Carlson went over the details for the Lent and Holy Week services. The theme is "The Seven Letters to the Seven Churches". The Imposition of Ashes will be offered at the Ash Wednesday service. He completed the series on 1 Thessalonians for adult Sunday School. The "How Now Shall We Think?" series will start next. VBS will be held July 20-24 this year. We will use an Answers In Genesis program for the kids. The plan for the adults is the topic "For God so Loved the World". Pastor Earl and Joan Korhonen will also be here.
- 2. The Finance Committee reported that expenditures where a little higher than income in January due to some extra one-time items. Overall though, we are doing well. We have started a discussion on a long-term financial reserve strategy.
- 3. The Worship Committee met to discuss details on hymns, sermon texts, and a schedule of who would deliver the message for the Lent and Holy Week services. We will be adding an afternoon service on Good Friday. They also discussed recent problems with livestreaming and possibly hiring an IT specialist. Worship In The Woods begins May 25th and ends August 31st.
- 4. The Parish Life Committee presented the planned schedule of events for the year which also went in the February newsletter. Plans were also made for a potluck on March 30th. Details will be posted in the bulletin in March.
- 5. The Social Concerns Committee would like to participate in a CW Human services project called "Baskets of Hope". We would collect small toys for baskets through the month of March. This was approved. The PDHC baby bottle campaign wrapped up and Kristin G. will pick up the bottles on the 24th.
- 6. The Property Committee reported that the Handicap sign at the rear entrance of the church was replaced. The carpets in the church, parsonage, and PCC were steam cleaned, and two of the Sunday School rooms in the church were repainted.
- 7. The Youth Committee reported that the Spaghetti Dinner held on February 8th was a success! The kids raised over \$1400 for their FLY trip. The committee is also in the process of planning the transportation and lodging details for the FLY trip. The next Youth Second Sunday meeting will be on March 9th. In addition to the normal activities, Michelle Staffan will be leading bell choir for the kids.
- 8. The Evangelism Committee is making plans to host speakers from Chosen People Ministries on March 30th.

Boris Goldin

"Brothers and sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved." - Romans 10:1

Boris Goldin moved to New York from Russia. He came looking for the "American Dream" - security and success, but his search took a whole different turn when his wife, Shulamit, became a believer in Yeshua (Jesus). Boris resisted her witness and argued vehemently with her. But as he began to read the Bible for himself, he sensed the reality of God. After a year and a half of searching, he accepted Yeshua as his Savior.

Boris helped begin a few new Russian outreaches in Brooklyn, New York. He knew God was calling him to serve in full-time ministry so he left a successful insurance business to become a missionary with Chosen People Ministries and also help lead a Russian-speaking congregation in South Florida.

In the many years since that time, Boris is now leading the work of CPM in the Ukraine and has helped to build a network of more than twenty Messianic congregations, which are working with Chosen People Ministries. At the same time, he has very fruitful ministry among Jewish people in Israel, Russia and Germany. Boris is also the President of the Association of Russian-speaking Messianic Jewish Congregations of America.

In addition to being a gifted evangelist and teacher, Boris Goldin is an effective preacher of God's Word. His passion is to see Jewish people throughout the world accept Yeshua as their promised Messiah.

Chosen People Ministries exists to pray for, evangelize, disciple and serve Jewish people everywhere and to help others do the same. Chosen People Ministries serves in 16 countries around the world with headquarters in New York City.

Extra Reading Opportunities


