## **“The Royal Road”**

### **(By Thomas ‘a Kempis)**

“There will always be many who love Christ’s heavenly kingdom, but few who will bear His cross. Jesus has many who desire consolation, but few who care for adversity. He finds many to share His table, but few who will join Him in fasting. Many are eager to be happy with Him; few wish to suffer anything for Him. Many will follow Him as far as the breaking of bread, but few will remain to drink from His passion. Many are awed by His miracles; few accept the shame of His cross.

Many love Christ as long as they encounter no hardship; many praise and bless Him as long as they receive some comfort from Him. But if Jesus hides Himself and leaves them for a while, they either start complaining or become dejected. Those, on the contrary, who love Him for His own sake and not for any comfort of their own, praise Him both in trial and anguish of heart as well as in the bliss of consolation. Even if Jesus should never comfort them, they would continue to praise and thank Him. What power there is in a pure love for Jesus – love that is free from all self-interest and self-love!

Take up your cross; therefore, and follow Jesus, and you will inherit everlasting life. Behold, in the cross is everything, and upon your dying on the cross everything depends. There is no other way to life and to true inward peace than the way and discipline of the cross.

Realize that to know Christ you must lead a dying life. The more you die to yourself, the more you will live unto God. You will never enjoy heavenly things unless you are ready to suffer hardship for Christ. Nothing is more acceptable to God, nothing more helpful for you on this earth. When there is a choice to be made, take the narrow way. This alone will make you more like Christ.”

This is an abbreviated portion from Thomas ‘a Kempis’ longer writing of “The Royal Road.” I read it as part of my personal Lenten reading from the book, “Bread and Wine.” ‘A Kempis is most famous for his book, “*The Imitation of Christ*.” He was devoted to following Christ and was deeply concerned for the devotional life of Christians. He was German-Dutch and lived in Germany between 1380 – 1471. As I read his entire piece, I thought of how shallow much of evangelical Western Christianity is today. Indeed, how shallow and spiritually self-centered we all are as we struggle to follow Christ for the sake of Christ alone, rather than keeping a close eye on “what is in it for us.” We so easily become “consumer Christians” rather than committed disciples of Jesus who desire to follow Him anywhere, even to the cross, because of WHO He is. This Lenten Season, each day, let’s seek to take up the cross of Christ, not to save ourselves, but to be sanctified in Christ, as we walk “The Royal Road” with Jesus.

*“Then Jesus said to His disciples, ‘If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it; but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it.’ - Matthew 16:24,25*

## **FROM THE COUNCIL**



1. Pastor reflected on how much has taken place at the church in just 5 weeks. The Valentine's dinner, Family Bible Night, and the Children's Bible and Craft Class have all been great times of fellowship and learning. We continue to have visitors most weeks. He is soliciting suggestions for future adult Sunday School topics. Pastor went over the Lent Season schedule, including the FLBC Choir performance on March 18th.
2. The Finance Committee chair reported that the January General fund income is less than in 2025. However, there is one less Sunday this year, and we had a lot of snow that has curbed attendance. A motion was made and passed to correct mismatches in two asset funds in the financial software. Lilane Fox was removed from church bank accounts and Earl Staffan was added (Council president is put on church accounts).
3. The Parish Life Committee chair shared the finalized schedule of events for the year to be added to the church calendar. Parish Life will help take care of meals for the AFLBC choir so \$200 was approved for food.
4. The Property Committee chair reported that we required a lot more than usual in snow removal costs (and he removed a lot himself!). Several of the tube light bulbs in the PCC were replaced. Greg passed on estimates from providers concerning HVAC work for the church. The mechanical room in the church was cleaned and old/un-needed items thrown away.
5. The Social Concerns Committee chair reported that we will participate in the CW Human Services "Baskets of Hope" program. They are requesting bubbles and sidewalk chalk for 50-60 baskets. Sign-up sheets for helping at Foundation Dinners are on the tables in the church. The PDHC baby bottles will be picked up on 2/24.
6. The Youth Committee chair reported that they made over \$1500 from the Valentine's dinner for the FLY fund. Youth meetings will resume in March.
7. The Education Committee chair reported that all current programs are going smoothly. Leslie Hall started a Bible Lesson/Craft class in the church basement to be held every Friday afternoon. There were 19 children in attendance for the first class. Kay Knode and Nikki Hall helped.
8. The Stewardship Committee chair reported that they will continue to meet at 2pm. They approved sending \$2000 to Samaritan's Purse for ice storm relief.
9. The Worship Committee chair reported that they are discussing going back to real candles for Christmas Eve services. They are working on Lent/Holy Week special music and will also be looking at incorporating more liturgy into worship services (subject to Council approval).
10. The Evangelism Committee chair reported that they will have a meeting concerning the live nativity on 2/21.
11. PCC usage was approved for Kennedy Sherman, the 4-H group, and Janet Morris. The Lent offerings will go to Compassionate Hope mission, except for March 18th. Those will go to the FLBC choir, as they will perform at that service.


# Another Great Spaghetti Dinner by our Youth!

# Chocolate Sundae Crunch

From "Cooking with Calvary"

## Crust

1 c. flour  
1/4 c. firmly packed brown sugar  
1/2 c. butter  
1/2 c. chopped nuts

## Filling

1 (3 3/4 oz. pkg.) instant French vanilla or vanilla pudding mix  
1 c. milk  
2 c. (1 pt.) vanilla ice cream, slightly softened



## Topping

3 Tbsp. evaporated or whole milk  
1/2 c. chocolate chips  
1/2 c. miniature marshmallows

Directions:

Crust:

In large mixing bowl, combine flour and brown sugar. Cut in butter until crumbly, then stir in the nuts. Spread the crumb mixture in an ungreased 8 or 9 inch square baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes until light golden brown. Cool completely. Crumble the baked mixture, reserving 1/2 cup for topping. Spread and lightly press remaining crumbs in the same baking pan.

Filling:

In a large mixing bowl, combine dry pudding mix with milk. Beat for 2 minutes at low speed, scraping the sides of the bowl frequently. Add softened ice cream and blend at low speed just until the mixture is smooth and creamy. Pour over the crumb crust and sprinkle the top with reserved crumbs.

Topping:

In medium saucepan, combine the evaporated milk, chocolate chips, and marshmallows. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until chocolate pieces and marshmallows are melted. Drizzle over the crumb crust and filling. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours. This dessert may also be frozen. To use, move from the freezer to the refrigerator for 2 hours before serving, or let stand at room temperature for 1/2 hour.

## Lenten donation mission support for 2026

This year, donations from the Wednesday evening Lenten services will be given to *Compassionate Hope Philippines* Children's Rescue. Specifically we will be supporting the Rees family.

Jeremy and Brittanie Rees moved to the Philippines in January of 2025 to support the two Villages of Hope there. Along with their two children, Georgia (8) and Shiloh (4), they are serving on the island of Mindanao, Philippines. Their growing location will eventually provide refuge to as many as 200 children rescued from Online Sexual Exploitation, Human, and Cyber Trafficking.

After 21+ years in the Army Reserves and 13 years in the non-profit sector with Water Mission and Habitat for Humanity, Jeremy is trusting God's direction in using these and other skillsets to care for and provide servant-leadership to the staff and children in the homes. Brittanie has served as the Director of Children's Ministry for Lighthouse Church North Charleston and led international mission and ecotourism trips and has long felt the call to become a 'mother to many'.

The Rees family has prayed and waited for many years for the opportunity to go, all the while listening to God's call to serve 'the least of these'; they are full of joy and anticipation to see how they will be used.
